### Day 1 TOUR START DATE | Tuesday, June 21: Arrive in Kyiv (-/-/D)

Welcome to Ukraine! Setting foot in the homeland of your ancestors is a privilege, and an inspiring experience. Our life-changing journey starts in the place where it all began – the foundations of the Kyivan Rus', the center of major trade routes through Europe and Asia, and the cradle of Christianity and Ukrainian sovereignty – Kyiv. This beautiful and historic city has played a key part in the past, present and future of this country and still blends the ancient and the modern.

Soak up the history of Kyiv. Feel the power of the many battles which took place in and around this historic capital, while taking in the new vibrant atmosphere it has created as a modern-day metropolis.



After you touch down on Ukrainian soil, you'll be met at the airport by your Tour Leader and chauffeured to your hotel.

Your **Tour Leader** will be with you throughout your entire trip. More than just a guide - they will be your personal travel hosts, along with your private vehicle and driver. Together they will make sure you get where you want to go and be available to stop at your convenience along the way. Not to mention, they will show you the best places to eat and help you with everything from using the bank machines to showing you where to find the best gifts at the market and negotiating for the best price. They will be there for you to share the best of Ukraine and tell you about history and about modern Ukraine as well. And if there are any unforeseen circumstances, they will make sure everything gets worked out. You're in good hands!

Start discovering Kyiv on our guided **city orientation**, where we will show you around the local neighborhood and help familiarize yourself with this historic capital city. We will introduce you to delicious places to eat, small hideaways to grab a cup of coffee and we'll make sure you know where to find ATMs, bottled water and all the things you might want.

It's your first night in Ukraine and the evening will showcase local hospitality. Tonight, you will be taken out to a traditional **Welcome Dinner** at one of the best, most authentic restaurants downtown! Enjoy local cuisine in an authentic, lively atmosphere.

#### Day 2 | Wednesday, June 22: Kyiv (B/L/D)

To help you feel at home, we'll go on a **combined city tour (bus + walking)**. We'll explore the 'heart' of Kyiv: **Independence Square**, better known as Maidan. This is the place which has changed history, where the

Orange Revolution and Revolution of Dignity happened and we'll learn about each of these important moments.

Next, we will see some of Kyiv's most iconic sites, such as **St. Volodymyr's Cathedral**, **the Golden Gates of Kyiv**, **and St. Sophia's Cathedral** – places which date back to the 10th century! Travellers from Ukraine and abroad come to this pilgrimage place to see 1000-year-old frescoes and mosaics and feel the spirit of tradition.



We'll have a good lunch and then take a bit of free time to explore on your own. You can choose to go shopping on **Andriyivsky Uzviz (Andrivivsky Descent)** - a cobblestoned street that's home to the city's artisans, craftsmen and vendors. Discover all kinds of items in their stalls - from unique works of art to souvenir trinkets to authentic Ukrainian clothing! Tour leaders will be ready to point you in whatever direction you'd like to go.

In the evening we'll gather for a **traditional dinner** in our favourite local restaurants. Paying homage to Ukraine's rich musical history, we'll soak up the melodies from a traditional Ukrainian group, join in with song and dance and toast our colorful heritage!

#### Day 3 | Thursday, June 23: Kyiv - Chernivtsi (B/L/D)

Today we'll discover more about Kyiv's storied history and we start at the Holodomor museum. Here we will pay our respects to those who suffered one of the most terrible crimes against the Ukrainian nation: famine. Learn about the tragedy at the museum before walking around the memorial park, and taking a moment to reflect at the monument.

Next, we'll visit a world famous historical and architectural landmark, and one of Ukraine's most important Christian sites: the Pecherska Lavra Cave Monastery. Enjoy the guided tour, taking you down into the candlelit, underground labyrinths filled with the relics and ancient mummified monks – intriguing to say the least!

After the tour, we'll have lunch and then drive everyone to the downtown core where you will have the afternoon to explore and get ready for our overnight train ride in the evening.

Transfer to the train station. Catch the train Kyiv - Chernivtsi #117K, depart at 08:05PM - arrive at 07:57AM. Train travel in Ukraine is fun! You'll have a sleeping berth with a bed, fresh linens, window and door for privacy. Travel the way locals do and fall asleep to the gentle swaying of your train carriage. PLEASE NOTE: your Tour Leader will provide you snacks and water on the train (incl.)

#### Day 4 | Friday, June 24: Chernivtsi (B/L/D)

Welcome to the ethnographic region of Bukovyna. Many Ukrainians emigrated from the Bukovyna area, and were spread far and wide across the world. This region was the crossroads and border area between Halychyna and Moldavia, and has changed hands many times across the centuries, but has also been its own autonomous state! An important educational site, many writers and academics lived and worked here across the years, including the famous Olha Kobylianska. Discover more about this region, about our ancestors and the lives they used to live.



Welcome to **Chernivtsi**, a beautiful multicultural city, considered one of Ukraine's most important educational centers.

Upon arrival, we will whisk you to your hotel and get you checked-in. Take some free time to get freshened up, have a good breakfast in the hotel and relax. The morning is yours to have a nap, stretch your legs, or people watch in an outdoor café.

We'll all meet for lunch in a traditional restaurant in the city center. After we're well fed, we'll visit the **Bukovynian Diaspora Museum** – a fascinating museum which tells the story of the migration of Ukraine people. Learn all about how people from region of Bukovyna left the area in the end of the 19<sup>th</sup>–20<sup>th</sup> century. During the time when Bukovyna was part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, more than 50,000 Bukovynians went overseas, mostly to Canada and the U.S. The exhibits here describe the challenging social and economic situation that was present in the area and motivated the first (so-called economic) wave of immigration.

Afterwards, you'll have an opportunity to explore the city on your own. We suggest you take a walk along Olha Kobylyanska Street, a beautiful cobblestone boulevard, where you can find cosy cafes with street-side terraces, street musicians and picturesque buildings.

In the evening, we'll have dinner in one of our favourite restaurants downtown. You are free to spend the rest of the evening at your leisure and we'll definitely share a few of the best places to find a local pint and delicious night cap.

### Day 5 | Saturday, June 25: Chernivtsi (B/L/D)

We'll start the day by embarking on a **walking city tour**. We'll learn Chernivtsi's fascinating multicultural history and see the most beautiful and notable sights of its elegant past – city squares, unique cathedrals, museums and stylish coffee shops and restaurants.

Later on, enjoy a visit to an architectural gem - **the Chernivtsi National University.** This stunning collection of buildings will make you feel as though you have stepped back in time! The University's main campus, the Residence of Bukovynian and Dalmatian Metropolitans are included on the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

After working up a bit of an appetite, we'll enjoy lunch together and then you're free to explore the city on your own. Your Tour Leaders will give you lots of options of what to do, where to go, and of course, places to find a local drink.

We'll meet again in the evening for a special treat – a private performance of the **local folk ensemble – Gerdan,** who passionately represent the rich cultural heritage of this region. You don't want to miss this!

The performance will be followed by a delicious Bukovynian-style dinner at '**Hopachok'** restaurant.

#### Day 6 | Sunday, June 26: Chernivtsi – Tulova – Carpathian Mountains (B/L/D)

Returning to the homeland of your ancestors is like stepping back in time, and today we will do just that: take you back in time.

After a hearty breakfast in the hotel, we will check out and move on to our next destination – a quaint little village called **Tulova**.

There, we will prepare something special and unique for you! We will **recreate the departure of Ukrainian Pioneers to Canada**, imagining how it looked like back in the 19<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup> centuries. Feel the emotional journey your ancestors took as we recreate their departure from this village, and in many ways looks just like the other villages left behind by our forefathers.

A few of us will have the opportunity to get dressed up in antique clothing, as our ancestors would have done. We will visit the local church to pray for our ancestors and the bond we keep to their homeland. We will get into the horse-drawn wagon with our bags and 'depart' for a new life in a new promised land...

After, once memories have been made and photos taken, we will toast our ancestors 'village-style' and enjoy a local lunch in the village restaurant.

After we say our goodbyes to our new friends in the late afternoon, we drive to the magnificent and mesmerizing **Carpathian Mountains** to a place called **Kosiv**.

We'll get everyone checked into this mountain hideaway hotel and then enjoy dinner at the hotel's picturesque restaurant.

The evening is yours- wander around the grounds of our hotel, swim in the outdoor pool, relax at the sauna or simply enjoy the stunning views of the mountains.

#### Day 7 | Monday, June 27: Kosiv – Kryvorivnya – Hutsul Grazhda - Kosiv (B / L / D)

The beautiful Carpathian Mountains are home to sweeping green forests, flowing rivers and breath-taking waterfalls – it's hard not to feel at-one with nature when you breathe in the fresh mountain air...This is the land of the Hutsuls, Boykos, Lemkos and other native ethnical groups whose colorful folk culture is laced through thin villages stretching along wide valley floors.



Today, we will visit the picturesque village of **Kryvorivnya**, a source of inspiration for Ukrainian writers, historians and other prominent figures of Ukrainian science and culture.

Here, we will visit a traditional Hutsul house-fortress called **Hutsul Grazhda**. This is an impressive piece of architecture, preserved for centuries, and a visit feels like you are stepping back in time as you pass through its low wooden doors. Now protected as a museum, it displays many artifacts representing the local way of life. It

was here that the famous film "Shadows of Forgotten Ancestors" was filmed. We'll also visit an ancient wooden **Hutsul church** that dates back to the 18th century. This church, in all the three centuries it has existed, has never been closed – not due to war or famine or age.

We will enjoy a good Hutsul lunch and the head back to our Carpathian Mountain hotel. Check-in.

Enjoy a free evening - go swim in the pool or make a hike through the mountains, prepare shish kebab, spend some time with locals, or simply relax back at the hotel and enjoy the view of the mountains - it's up to you!

#### Day 8 | Tuesday, June 28: Kosiv – Mountain Village – Kosiv (B / L / D)

Time to shop! We'll visit the local **Kosiv Bazaar**, where local artisans skillfully produce embroidery, antiques, hand-made jewelry, wood carvings and pottery. Spend some time shopping for souvenirs! (We hope there's lots of room in your suitcases!)

After we've shopped, we have the unique opportunity to experience world-famous Ukrainian hospitality and traditions, as we invite you to a **Hutsul Wedding celebration** in a Carpathian 'village above the clouds'. You will be introduced to ancient traditions that Hutsul people preserve and pass from one generation to another. Live music, classic Arkan and Holubka dances, delicious homemade food, and golden-root vodka are the highlights of the day that will keep your soul and body forever young. You will make memories which last a lifetime!

After we've finished celebrating, we'll head back to our Carpathian Mountain hotel and you can enjoy dinner (if you still have any room in your belly). Kick back and have the evening at your leisure.

### Day 9 | Wednesday, June 29: Kosiv – Kolomyya – Ivano-Frankivsk (B / L / D)

We're moving on to our next destination – **Ivano-Frankivsk**, a charming city with a wealth of history.

On our way, we will stop in a quaint little town called **Kolomyya**. Here, we will visit the world's only **Pysanka (Easter Egg) Museum,** which houses a unique and rich collection of pysanky - about 12, 000 Easter Eggs from

different regions of Ukraine and from artists around the world, including Canada! This two-story building even looks like a large Easter egg.

To help imagine how our ancestors lived in this part of Ukraine, we'll stop at the **Hutsul Ethnography Museum** – which houses an incredible collection of costumes, tools, and art.

We'll enjoy a traditional Kolomyya lunch and then continue on to Ivano-Frankivsk.

We'll check you in to your hotel, and then help get your bearings on

**a city tour** and discover what makes this city so special. Once we've worked up an appetite, we'll have dinner together in one of our favorite restaurants in Ivano-Frankivsk.

### Day 10 | Thursday, June 30: Ivano-Frankivsk – Nebyliv – Ivano-Frankivsk (B / L / D)

Today we will journey to the village of **Nebyliv.** It was from here that the very first settlers from Ukraine – Ivan Pylypiv and Vasyl Ilyniak - travelled to Canada more than 130 years ago. Pay tribute at the **monument to Pylypiv and Ilyniak** in the centre of the village, and lay flowers in memory of them, to pay homage to all those immigrants who followed in their footsteps.

We'll head back to Ivano-Frankisvk and treat you to a great lunch in one of the local restaurants.

Continue exploring Ivano-Frankivsk on your own. In times of prosperity, Ivano-Frankivsk was a large trade and handiwork center, attracting artisans from far and wide. In addition to fascinating historic and architectural riches, Ivano-Frankivsk is known for its leisurely attitude to life! Your Tour Leaders will help you with suggestions of must-visit places in the city.

We'll share a meal in a traditional restaurant and then you're free to explore the city's craft beer scene, historic centre or cool cocktail bars.

### Day 11 CANADA DAY | Friday, July 1: Ivano-Frankivsk - Lviv (B / L / D)

Lviv, historical capital of Halychyna and Western Ukraine, is considered to be one of the main cultural centers of the country. This city has an ancient and varied history – Lviv was formerly a princely state, then later a part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, and then the Polish Kingdom. It has seen many occupations, battles and wars fought on its territory, but its unyielding Ukrainian nationalism has preserved throughout. A pinnacle of Ukrainian culture and patriotism, you will truly feel the Ukrainian spirit in this beautiful city.



We conclude our pilgrimage journey to Ukraine in its Western capital and cultural heartland **Lviv**, where we go this morning after breakfast and checkout. Thousands of our ancestors left Ukraine from the Halychyna region. This is where many diaspora Ukrainian come to feel at home in their hearts and souls. You might be surprised to find that this city feels a bit like home, even if you've never visited before. Lviv is a timeless city which prides itself in its celebration of all things Ukrainian – culture, language, cuisine and history.

Upon arrival in Lviv, we'll help out with check-in to your hotel and show you around on a **city orientation** to get the lay of the land in this medieval town. We will show you around the local neighborhood and help you get familiarized with the area.



Today we will pay an important tribute to our heritage – **Canada Day celebrations**! Canada and Ukraine have always had a long-standing, close relationship. In addition, we will commemorate the **130**<sup>th</sup> **Anniversary of Ukrainian Immigration to Canada** and attend a special meeting with Lviv City Council officials. The official reception will take place in **City Hall**. We'll have some photos taken and commemorate the connection between our two countries! (Celebrations & event details – TBC).

In the evening, we'll get together for a **Festive dinner** where everyone will have a chance to try delicious dishes as well as listen to some Ukrainian songs from our special guests!

#### Day 12 | Saturday, July 2: Lviv (B / L / D)

#### Enjoy a free morning at leisure!

You might choose to drink a fragrant coffee in one of the most unique coffee shops in the city. It'll be quite a surprise! Learn about the history, enjoy the aromas of fresh ground coffee and get to know why Lviv is called the 'The City of Coffee'.

To start out the afternoon, we share in a lunch at a favourite restaurant of ours.

Then, we will show you around picturesque Lviv on a **walking city tour**, which will give you a better understanding of the city history and vibe.

Founded in the 13th Century by Prince Danylo of Halychyna, he named Lviv after his son, Lev. "Lev" is also the word for lion, which became the symbol of the city. Danylo founded the hilltop fort which is called High Castle Hill, or "Vysokyy Zamok". After the death of his father, Lev became Prince, and Lviv became the capital of the principality of Halychyna-Volhynia. Though Lviv has changed hands many times over the years, Lviv has never forgotten its Ukrainian roots, and this is evident in the passion of the people. Where Kyiv is considered the head of Ukraine, Lviv is considered the heart.

Enjoy some free time walking around the welcoming narrow cobblestoned streets. Take advantage of shopping in the city - there are numerous souvenir stores, and an open-air craft market, which offers a variety of artwork, embroidered blouses, woodcarving and more! You are sure to bring back more than fond memories from Lviv!

This evening, to wrap up our pilgrimage tour in Ukraine, we'll get together for a delicious dinner in one of our favorite restaurants.
